## PINE NEEDLE PRESS

**FALL CLEAN SWEEP** will be **October 1, 2022, 8 AM to 11 AM**. We **DO NOT** accept mattresses, electronics, building materials or tires. At the Spring Clean Sweep, someone waited until workers left and then deposited 2 mattresses. The town was fined for this, so cameras will be utilized to try to prevent further violations. Violators will be ticketed. Sorry to have to do that but some people spoil it for everyone else. **PLEASE FOLLOW THE RULES.**

**July 12, 2022, Board Meeting:** 1) Comments were made about the July 4<sup>th</sup> activities. 2) Supervisor Lovato reported the County had bulldozed the path between Veterans Park and the fishing pond and gravel was going to be obtained. 3) The Interior Committee placed flower planters around town; 4) Dennis Plemel was commended for his work on storm damage cleanup. Branches were chipped and mulch is available to residents if needed; 5) Supervisor White reported sections of Lily Lake Rd. were ground up and will be blacktopped at the end of August; 6) Chairman Radtke reported 10 permits had been issued by the Zoning Dept. **August 2, 2022, Board Meeting:** 1) Joe Stoll commented on highway signs on Hwy 8 that need fixing. The State will be contacted as it is their responsibility; 2) Supervisor Lovato commented someone left sections of 3" pipe in the recycling container which resulted in the town being fined \$90.00. **September 13, 2022, Board Meeting:** 1) Jim Shelton commented that Dave Schultz, former owner/operator of North County Inn, had passed away; 2) Supervisor White reported that Lily Lake Rd. would be blacktopped the following day; 3) Supervisor White reported that the front end loader is nearing the end of its useful life and plans should be made in the near future to replace it; 4) Supervisor Lovato reported that the walking trail between the Veterans Park and the fishing pond is open, that Kelly Marinoff had obtained 5 more planters to be placed around town, and plans were being made for needed work at the ball field; 5) Roger Cudnohufsky reported he is working on the welcome signs on both ends of town; 6) Bill Stankovich reported on the defeat of the proposed wheel tax and septic fee at the County Board meeting; 7) Fall Clean Sweep is scheduled for October 1<sup>st</sup> and measures are being taken to ensure that people do not deposit prohibited items in the dumpsters after the workers leave. This problem has caused the town to be fined in the past by Waste Management. 8) Approval was given to move the town's bank accounts from Stephenson National Bank to Incredible Bank; and 9) a decision on approving the proposed Town Fee Schedule was tabled due to changes needed in the schedule.

### BRUCE'S REFRIGERATOR ZUCCHINI PICKLES

2 CUPS WATER\*      1 CUP WHITE VINEGAR\*  
1/4 CUP SUGAR\*      1 ½ TSP SALT

(Add garlic and dill to taste)

ZUCCHINI SPEARS

(\*Adjust according to your individual taste)

Cook water, vinegar, sugar & salt long enough to dissolve sugar and salt. Let cool slightly. Cut unpeeled zucchini into spears (smaller zucchini – not big honkers!!) Add zucchini spears to brine.

Refrigerate in jars or other container at least 3 days before eating.
